I am writing to discuss our maths curriculum and how you can help your child at home with maths.


Our curriculum

As a school, we use the White Rose Maths scheme. The full curriculum, in the order we teach it, can be found here:

Please select your child's year group (ensuring you have selected Version 3) and press filter. You can then click on

each 'Unit of learning' and view the 'Scheme of learning'. This will show you the small steps for learning, key questions, key learning concepts and example activities.

How can I help?

At an early age, playing games, singing number songs and practising quick recognition of amounts and digits is vital. Simple games like 'Snakes and Ladders' are great for number recognition.

Latterly, practicing number bonds (two numbers that make a total) and times tables will significantly help.

Measure is challenging to teach out of context, so cooking, making and telling the time are all great skills to do at home.

White Rose Maths have a free app called 'One Minute Maths' which is great for regular practice of key skills.
