

Introduction

As a small, rural Primary, Bridestowe prides itself on its warm and welcoming atmosphere and its strong connections with the local community.

Our school is part of the Dartmoor Multi Academy Trust (DMAT) which includes 14 local primary schools and 3 secondaries. Within the DMAT, we are part of the Moorland Hub including Boasley Cross Primary School, Exbourne C of E Primary School, Highampton Primary School, Lydford Primary School and Northlew Primary School. The Moorland Hub has provided many additional opportunities for our schools to support and work together. As a result, we have been able to offer a range of enrichment activities, often combining our pupils for experiences, such as Theatre trips and residential trips to outdoor adventure centres and to Bristol.

Bridestowe has provided education for the local community for over 160 years. The original Trust Deed establishing the school in 1862 by the Church of England, recognised the importance of learning long before the main Education Act of 1870.

We sincerely hope your child will enjoy the time they spend at Bridestowe and within our DMAT Family. All staff endeavour to support pupils to be the best they can possibly be. Learning is a partnership, and we aim, from our first meeting, to establish good communication between home and school to make sure pupils achieve their full potential.

Our School has the highest expectations of each child, and we encourage our pupils to achieve academically and to become active contributors to society. Learning is a lifelong process and we aim to place sound foundations for all our pupils to gain success in their future lives.

As a competitive school, competition is actively promoted, and all pupils are supported to participate in a range of festivals and tournaments. How do we care for our pupils?

Our school community has a duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. This includes ensuring all pupils are guided in their spiritual, moral, social and cultural values. Lesson and assembly planning for subjects such as Religious Education, taking part in school trips, community and sporting events, and having very active school councils are just some of the things Bridestowe School does to promote these values.







Admissions

Children who will be aged 4 between 1st September 2022 and 31st August 2023 will attend school full time from September 2023. We encourage new children to attend afternoon sessions during the summer term. These visits help your child to settle more easily when they start full time. They are able to get used to the new routines of school, meet and get to know the other children and staff, and develop their independence in the setting.

Attendance

It is essential that the school is notified as soon as possible if your child is going to be absent or arrive late.

The law does not grant parents an automatic right to take their child out of school for holidays during term time. You must apply for permission in advance and if the school refuses your request and the child is still taken out of school, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and this may make you liable to a fine.

School Times

<u>Morning:</u> 9.00am – 12.15pm <u>Afternoon:</u> 1.15pm – 3.15pm

Whilst we require all children to be in school in good time, for legal and insurance reasons we cannot be responsible for the children before 8.50am.

Curriculum

The curriculum content at Bridestowe School follows the requirements of the National Curriculum. Curriculum policies and long and medium term planning are available for English, Mathematics, Science, Design & Technology, Computing, History, Geography, Music, Art, P.E., R.E. and PSHE. Our curriculum is engaging, thought provoking and gives the children a solid foundation of knowledge. Areas of study are broad and balanced and allow children to follow their interests whilst meeting the requirements of the National Curriculum 2014.

Homework

Homework supports the school curriculum in a number of ways. All pupils should take their reading books home daily and parents are asked to ensure that their child spends time reading with them. Research and other core tasks may be given to support the school topics.

Off Site Activities

The school organises a range of offsite activities to supplement and extend the curriculum and may ask for voluntary contributions to help fund them. The older children will have opportunities such as a trip to a large city, and to experience a residential 'outdoor adventure' trip.

Breaktime

All of our children have breaktime together on the playground in the mid-morning. Year 6 children are trained as play leaders and facilitate games and resources for the other children. The mixture of ages allows a strong sense of school family. Children in the Early Years and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a free piece of fruit at breaktimes. Free milk is also provided for those children under 5.

Lunchtime

Lunch is a communal meal for all our children. School meals are available every day and are freshly cooked in our on-site kitchen. There is always a choice of meal including a vegetarian option, baked potato or sandwich. The kitchen staff are allergen aware and are happy to provide allergy information on request. All children in Foundation and Key Stage 1 are eligible for Universal Free School Meals.

If you prefer to send your child with a packed lunch please be aware that we are a NUT FREE school due to severe allergies amongst our children.

After School Clubs

We offer a range of extra-curricular clubs including; Cookery, Mindfulness, Debating, Music, Multi-Skills, Netball, Dance, Orienteering and Tag Rugby throughout the year.

PE and Sport

All of our children get to take part in a variety of activities and sports throughout the academic year, some of which are led by either teaching staff or others by outside coaches. We employ a PE lead teacher within the Moorland Hub who ensures quality-first sport, and annually the whole school takes part in swimming lessons.

We attend a number of events, hosted by neighbouring primaries, such as Cross Country, Multi-skills, Orienteering, Tag Rugby, Cricket, Rounders, Football and Netball.





Forest School

All of our children participate in Forest School activities with Dartmoor Ranger Rob Taylor. This universal offer to our children allows outdoor exploration, connection with nature, mindfulness and learning opportunities.

Safeguarding

All staff and volunteers at Bridestowe Primary School are committed to safeguarding. Staff attend regular safeguarding training and work hard to maintain a safe and secure environment for the children to be in. Volunteers who come into school and assist with driving to events, have all had full DBS checks.

Friends of Bridestowe School

FoBS is a group of parents and carers who fundraise and volunteer to support the school with extracurricular activities. FoBS have regularly supported school trips and visits, donated hoodies to Year 6 leavers and planned and facilitated many school events.

Uniform

All children at Bridestowe Primary School are required to wear uniform. This builds a sense of community and belonging to our school. The expectation is that a pullover/cardigan, shirt and tie are worn together for most of the year. From Summer half term (May) to Autumn half term (October), an open–neck short sleeve white shirt/blouse with no tie or pullover would be appropriate in warmer weather as an alternative.

Transfer to Secondary School

The majority of our children transfer to Okehampton Community College at the age of eleven. Parents will receive detailed information from the Local Authority on this matter.

The Staff who teach Year 7 children visit us during the final year and the children also visit the College. This enables smooth transition from the primary to secondary phase of your child's education.
