#### **OFSTED report**

This week saw the publication of our recent OFSTED report. We are extremely proud to have been rated 'Good' in all areas.

Particular highlights include 'Pupils are proud to belong to this school', 'pupils behave well and show respect for others. They demonstrate positive attitudes to their learning and start work quickly. Pupils who are new to the school describe it as a friendly and welcoming place.' and 'Teachers ensure that pupils with SEND can access the full curriculum. They identify pupils' needs as early as possible. Teachers adapt learning to ensure that all pupils can succeed'.

Of course, there are areas to improve upon and we have already taken swift action to address these.
