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OCRA-13 2024



Key Stage 2 children will be running a half marathon over the Summer Term. Children will run a total of 1 mile each week during the school day to achieve their own personal Half Marathon. The success of all children who complete the 'unofficial challenge' will be celebrated with a certificate awarded by school.

Children may also wish to run a weekly mile at the OCRA Pavilion on Thursdays at 4.30pm, free of charge. Parents would need to make their own arrangements for this.

Children can enter the 'official challenge' by following the link (there is no obligation to do so and this is the choice of families). For those children who enter they will run their final mile in Simmons Park on Sunday 14th July at 9:30am.

Entry into the OCRA-13 2024 is £9.50, for which children will receive an OCRA-13 T-shirt and medal, plus entry into the running event on Sunday 14th July, 9:30am. Please be aware that this is not an event organised by the school and parents will need to accompany children on Sunday 14th July – no school staff will be supervising.

Parents/guardians must advise the school on the first and <u>every</u> day of absence due to illness.



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
Barn Owls:

In English last term, we were reading lots of examples of fairy tales. The children have now 'published' their own. We are very proud of our work. In our Art/DT lessons, with Mrs Dewsberry, we are finishing our pop out books. We hope to share these books with the younger children very soon.





We have had a big focus on kindness in Barn Owls this week. Children have been practicing their conversational skills. We are developing active listening skills, our ability to ask follow up questions and effective body language.





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Snowy Owls:

The Snowy Owls have settled well into the Summer Term. We have started reading new texts in Book Club and English and the class have enjoyed predicting what might happen in the stories. During science, the children have conducted a scientific investigation and explored how the variables can impact the experiment. The children are investigating the impact of sunlight on growth and have changed the location of their seeds. They have kept all other variables the same to make the investigation fair. Ask your child about what our control variables were! We are looking forward to seeing some green shoots emerge soon.



Well done to all the children that completed their home learning last half term – it was great to read everyone's hard work over the Easter. Maths files have been sent home this week as well as information about our new learning focus. Don't forget to send children to school in PE kits on Tuesday and Wednesday.
