**School Games Sports Award – Gold**

The school is proud to announce that once again we have been awarded the Gold standard for school sports. This is a prestigious award that recognises the school's quality, range and commitment to school sports. You will see lots of examples of sports coming up, as well as healthy lifestyles and daily fitness activities happening in school. At the end of November we will welcome Team GB athlete Ezekiel Ewulo to the school - a further example of the priority status of sport in our school.

**Young Play Leaders**

On the 6<sup>th</sup> September the Year 6 children attended Young Play Leaders training and are now

leading playtime games and sharing equipment. This is a vital life skill which contributes to our family ethos. Barn Owls have since taught a PE lesson for the younger children which everyone thoroughly enjoyed.

## Happy and Safe Questions

In the event of an OFSTED inspection, parents will have the opportunity to state how much they agree with a series of statements.

The first two are '**My child is happy at this school**' and '**My child is safe at this school**'.

We have asked the children if they feel happy and safe at school.

We were delighted that **76 of 79** children we asked stated they were happy. The three that were not explained '*I'm not sure why*', '*I'm always in trouble*' and '*The learning is hard*'. We will be discussing and working with these children to find solutions to their worries.

**The school tirelessly endeavours to ensure all our children are happy by providing a warm and nurturing atmosphere, safe adults to speak to, and friendly children to play with.**

**77 of 79** children stated they felt safe. The two who did not explained '*I might give my cold to someone*' and '*People don't let me play*'. Again, we will be discussing these worries with the children to find a solution.

**Safeguarding is the school's Number 1 priority; all staff are regularly and appropriately trained to keep children safe in all ways - safe environments, online safety, bullying etc., along with home and out of school issues. More can be found on the school website.**

## Behaviour

The third OFSTED statement in the event of an inspection is '**The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved**'.

We put this to the children today by asking 'Are children well behaved at this school?' and 'If they are not, do teachers and teaching assistants do something about it?' **78 of the 79** children we asked unreservedly answered 'Yes'. The one who did not stated they were unsure and may not have understood the question.

The behaviour of our children is something we are very proud of and, in general, we have excellent behaviour across the school. Positive behaviour is always praised and recognised first. ## School Council Update – Crisp Packet Recycling

The School Council have met with Mr Hill to discuss their role within the school, charities they'd like to support and new school initiatives. Their first project is 'Crisp Packet Recycling' to help reduce waste going to landfill.

The school has registered to become a **Terracycle Collection Point** meaning all members of the community can bring empty (and preferably clean) crisp packets to the school which will then be sent for recycling.

An added bonus is that the school will receive **£1 for each kilogram** of crisp packets received. This money will be donated to FoBS to support their school projects.
