
All other children should not attend school as we cannot adequately staff safe ratios.

Problem Solving Wheel



Sometimes children can experience a small problem and the School Council have come up with 8 solutions to try to solve such a problem with each other, before going to an adult for help. On Wednesday the School Council led an assembly explaining what the wheel means and the 8 different solutions – the wheels are now displayed around the playground.




Words of the Week
