Bridestowe Primary raised £84.50 for Place2Be, and £66.90 for Heart Heroes. A big thank you to all children and families who kindly donated.




Swim Gala

Head Lice

Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice, using conditioner and a lice comb. If live lice are found please treat accordingly. While your child is clear of lice, a useful natural deterrent is to use a few drops of tea tree oil in 100ml of water, which can be sprayed onto hair on a daily basis before school. Thank you for your support.

Tawny Owls

This half term the Tawny Owls are learning about why the Easter story is important to Christians. This week they role-played The Last Supper. The children were the disciples, eating bread and drinking wine (squash), which was a symbol of Jesus' body and blood. What Parents & Carers Need to Know about OF RESTRICTION NGL (which stands for 'Not Gonna Lie') is an app through which users share a link to their Instagram story or Twitter account, inviting their followers to give anonymous feedback. The app include some prewritten questions (such as 'if you could change anything about me, what would it be?'), plus the option to ask followers to simply 'send me anonymous messages'.
