Dear Parents/Carers,

Covid cases in school

Unfortunately, two children who attend the school have tested positive for Covid-19. Their symptoms are mild.

The children have been in school up to and including the 11th of March. They have been advised to remain at home for a minimum of 5 full days subject to 2 negative LFTs. This takes the total number of positive cases in the school to 5 within the last 10 days.

I would strongly recommend parents be vigilant of covid symptoms in their children and complete a PCR if your child develops any covid symptoms.

Covid symptoms are defined as:

- A high temperature
- A new, continuous cough
- A loss or change to taste and smell

Individuals are not required to self-isolate and should continue attending school unless they become unwell or test positive for Covid-19.

Wider covid measures

We continue to take measures to prevent the spread of Covid-19 in school including:

- Enhanced hand washing for children and adults
- Hand sanitisation points
- Enhanced cleaning regimes
- Face coverings are highly recommended for staff in communal areas (unless exempt)
- Enhanced ventilation within school
- Carbon Dioxide monitors to ensure appropriate ventilation.
- Enhanced vigilance for symptoms of Covid-19.
